1. Official participants

- May 20; The five <u>Nordic countries</u> (Iceland, Sweden, Denmark, Norway, and Finland) have started construction of their joint Type A pavilion, a wooden building designed so as to allow the reuse of the wood after the Expo. The pavilion, which will feature a café on the rooftop, will introduce the Scandinavian model of the relationship between humans and nature.

2. Reports from the past week and plans for the upcoming week

- May 21; The <u>Grand Roof</u> was lit up at night for the first time, with the press in attendance. Approximately 90% of the structure has already been completed.


- May 23; The Association announced that it will adopt <u>facial recognition technology from NEC Corporation</u> for in-store payment and admission management. It will be the largest payment system operation in Japan for electronic money and face recognition. The system will allow visitors to shop empty-handed with advanced registration for facial and payment information. It will also prevent the use of fake tickets and passes at the entrance gate.







- May 24; The result of the second round of selected candidates for <u>food/beverage and</u> <u>merchandise facilities</u> were announced. <u>32 new outlets were selected</u> in addition to the six stores selected in the first round. Further 18 undecided plots and food trucks (24 slots) will be open to a subsequent public offering.

- May 24; <u>Kyoto National Museum and Nara National Museum</u> announced that they will be holding a two-month national treasure exhibition event between April 29 and June 15, 2025 at the Expo venue. A number of national treasures will be exhibited, including as Katsusika Hokusai's "Kanagawa Oki Namura", Tawaraya Sotatsu's "Wind God and Thunder God Drawing Screen" and a half-kneeling statue of a bodhisattva (Dennyo Yin Kannon).

3. Ticket sales and volunteers


- Number of tickets sales: 2,188,781 as of May 22
- Total number of volunteers applicants: <u>55,634 (final figure)</u>
 Given the large number of applicants, the number of registrations will be expanded from the 20,000 initially planned to 30,000. Of these, 14,000 volunteers will be deployed in the Expo venue and 16,000 will be engaged as city volunteers outside the venue.
